F O R E W O R D

We all know that the history of Texas owes much to the 18th century Spanish and Mexican settlements at San Antonio and Nacogdoches. We know, too, that voluminous collections of official and private documents and proceedings from these two settlements have been preserved for many years in the records and archives in Nacogdoches and in Austin. These old instruments to a considerable extent have been sorted, orderly assembled, and available in Austin and Nacogdoches to those interested in reading the originals. Those who have become familiar in some degree with the collections in Austin and Nacogdoches have known that a careful selection and assembling of these instruments in book form would greatly enhance their value to the interested reader.

Robert Bruce Blake realized this, and devoted more than thirty years of his life to this work. From the middle 1920's until the 1940's he resided at Nacogdoches and became familiar with the archives and records there. From 1942 until his death in 1955 he lived in Austin where the State Archives were available to him. This work was a tremendous undertaking, but quietly and efficiently he studied, translated, and classified the documents and records, and he himself typed the thirty thousand or more pages that make up these seventy-five volumes. He did his work without publicity, and without compensation other than the inward pleasure and satisfaction he must have felt in knowing that he was making available to future students and historians information that except for his interest and labor they might never have.

JURISDICTION OF NACOGDOCHES.

Goods That they Possess and with what Permission They Have Them

A log house on Lot 10 vs. Front (Torn)  
possessed without judicial document and only with permission of  
Don Bernardo Fernandez when he was Commandant in this Post,  
said Lot (Torn.)

A log house on Lot 30 vs. front and 100 depth, had from Jose  
Sanches of this vicinity by informal sale and (torn)  
has given 20 vs. to his sons-in-law Joaquin Montes and Juan Bel-  
anche for houses, said Lot was granted by Capt. Juan Cortes to  
Sanches.

A log house on a Lot 60 vs. front and 84 in depth, which was  
granted to his mother Rita Bergara by the Captain Don Juan Cor-  
tes; he has two mares, three cows and three oxen.

A log house on a Lot 30 vs. front and 53 in depth; he had it  
from the citizen Manuel de Acosta, contracted informally to said  
party, which was granted to him verbally by Captain Don Antonio  
Gil Ibarvo; he has 4 horses, 1 mare, 2 oxen and 3 cows.

A house on the bank s of Ayish Bayou on land of his father-in-  
law Edmund Quirk, who had it by sale authorized by Lieut. Don  
Miguel Musquiz; has 37 cattle, 8 horses and 61 hogs.

On which he has a log house with corn field and fruit trees, is  
enclosed by log fence; which land is one league to the north,  
another to the east, and to the west 200 vs. and to the south  
three-fourths of a league, inherited from his parents who had  
it by sale authorized by Capt. Don Juan Cortes; has 29 cattle  
17 horses, 2 yoke of oxen for carts.

Two log houses for residence; one that covers a grist mill, an-  
other for granary and two for his negroes, on land consisting of  
a league and a half front and same in depth, granted by Lieut.  
Don Jose Ma. Guadiana, on which he has a field and summer pas-  
tures; he has 26 horses and 26 head of cattle.

A log house on Lot 63 vs. Front and 32 depth bought from Juan Es-  
parza by informal sale, and he also has on the Ranch named San  
Jose a long house; the land of said Ranch consists of one-half  
league to the west, half a league to the east, and on the North  
bounded with land of Capt. Don Antonio Gil Ibarvo, who had it  
by informal sale from Dimas Moya, who before that possessed it  
as settler and asked possession of it of Capt. Don Juan Cortes  
and it was not given to him, and instead to the said Garza.

Goods That They Possess and With What Permission They Have Them

A loghouse on Lot of 20 vs. front (torn)  
had from Josefa Sierra of this neighborhood in (torn)  
horses.

A log house on lot of 126 vs. front (torn)  
has it cultivated in wheat and corn, and (torn)  
(Mc)Farland in sale authorized by the Capt. (torn)  
de Ugarte. Has 11 horses (torn)

A log house on his ranch known as that of Morillo, which land  
consists in 684 vs. front and depth of 276, had extrajudicially  
from Jose Morillo, who held it as a settler without judicial  
document; it is cultivated. He has 7 oxen, 8 cows and 3 horses.  
A lot of 100 vs. front and 130 depth, had by donation which Don  
Vicente Micheli made her authorized by lieut. Miguel Musquiz, on  
which she has a log house and planted in corn.  
A log house on land belonging to Juan Ignacio Pifermo; he culti-  
vates it in corn, and has 2 horses, 2 cattle and 8 hogs.

A log house on land one league square had by sale granted by Don  
Miguel Musquiz, on which he has a corn field; 6 cows with calves,  
4 tercieras, 1 yoke oxen, 2 bulls and 5 hogs.

A log house on Lot 60 vs. front and 60 depth, had in extrajudi-  
cial sale from Francisca Peres, to whom it was sold by D. Juan Cor-  
tes; cultivates it in corn; has 5 horses and 2 cows  
On which she has four log houses and field cultivated in corn,  
which land she holds from her deceased husband Mariano Ibarbo  
without judicial possession, and it was given to his son Jose  
Ignacio Ibarbo by decree of Don Jose Maria Guadiana on the 15  
of November, 1798. she has 47 cattle, 16 horses and 10 hogs.

A log house and field enclosed and cultivated in corn on the  
right bank of Angelina River, on which territory he asked a  
league and a half to the west, toward the south the same, and  
toward the east to where are the boundaries of Goguet, of the  
Commandant Don Jose Maria Guadiana in April, 1799 it was de-  
creed that he will be given possession of it without damage to  
third party, and has not been done, and he is possessing it with-  
out document of any kind. He has 7 horses, 20 cattle besides 2  
yoke of oxen, and one log house on left bank of said river on  
land of Don Bernardo d'Ortolandt.

Jose Ygnacio Y'barbo son of Mariano Y'barbo, who was brother of  
Capt. Gil Y'barbo. Mariano died prior to 1792, leaving  
eight brothers. Of whom were Juan Jose Y'barbo, Manuel  
Y'barbo, Anastacio Y'barbo, Pedro Y'barbo whose wife was  
Mrs. Juana de la Garza. Jose Ygnacio was the eldest bro.  
in the name of the seven minor brothers, in 1800.

That in the year 92 the Captain of the Cavalry for the Province of the Bahia del Espiritu Santo, D. Juan Antonio Cortez, by virtue of an order given by the honorable General D. Ramon de Castro, came to this town and a mandate having been ~~promulgated~~ proclaimed to the body guard that those whose lands were taken without ~~authority~~ their consent should appear before the above mentioned Commissioner with a memorial petitioning the return of the same, and having my petition presented at Don Joaquin crossing on the Angelina and order having been issued to the procurator D. Cayetano Zepeda, who was actual procurator giving him the authority to extend possession of land which were petitioned, extended to me in 16 May 1792. -- H-441.
