ANCESTOR'S SERVICES

The said Leonard Keeling Bradley who resided during the American Revolution at Parish of St. Jude, Surry Co, NC assisted in establishing American Independence, while acting in the capacity of Private and Lieutenant in North Carolina

My ancestor's services during the Revolutionary War were as follows:

Leonard Keeling Bradley served four months, beginning Jan. 1776, under Capt. Richard Goode; five months, beginning July 1776, under Capt. Richard Goode.
From June 1778, he served three months under John Litten Jones.
From Nov. 1778, he served nine months under Capt. Lewis.
From Oct. 1779, he served four months under Capt. Martin.
From March 6, 1780, he served under Capt. Lowman and was captured and later paroled May 20, 1780
From Sept. 1781, he served five months under Capt. Smith.

ELIGIBILITY CLAUSE

"Any woman is eligible for membership in the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution who is not less than eighteen years of age, and who is lineally descended from a man or woman who, with unfailing loyalty to the cause of American Independence, served as a sailor, or as a soldier or civil officer in one of the several Colonies or States, or in the United Colonies or States, or as a recognized patriot, or rendered material aid thereto; provided the applicant is personally acceptable to the Society." (Constitution, Article III, Section 1.)

Date of marriage may be substituted for dates of birth and death where such date proves the soldier to have been living during the Revolution and of a suitable age for service.

The following form of acknowledgement is required:

Applicant further says that the said Leonard Keeling Bradley (name of ancestor from whom eligibility is derived) is the ancestor mentioned in the foregoing application, and that the statements hereinafter set forth are true to the best of her knowledge and belief.

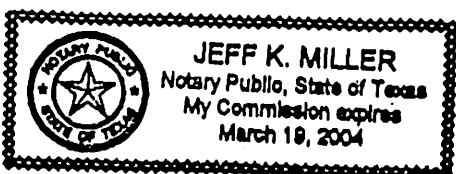
