ANCESTOR'S SERVICES

The said William Smith who resided during the American Revolution at Albemarle County, Virginia assisted in establishing American Independence, while acting in the capacity of (soldier in the 9th Virginia Regiment)
Pvt ✓ VA ✓

My ancestor's services during the Revolutionary War were as follows:
 William Smith served as a soldier in the Revolutionary War in the 9th Virginia Regiment, commanded by Col. George Matthews.
 William Smith's regiment was captured by the British and held as prisoners of war. After being confined on a prison ship for several months, the soldiers were exchanged and took their places in the army.
 About 1779, Col. Matthews was ordered to bring his regiment to Georgia to aid General Green in driving the "Red Coats" from Georgia and the Carolinas. This regiment participated in battles fought in Georgia, the Carolinas, and Virginia. The regiment also fought in the siege of Yorktown, where Cornwallis surrendered.
 Under the leadership of Col. Matthews, a large group of immigrants left Albemarle County, Virginia. William Smith and his family came with the group and settled in Washington County, Georgia, on Buffalo Creek, near the Oconee River.

(Constitution, Article III, Section 1.)

Date of marriage may be substituted for dates of birth and death where such date proves the soldier to have been living during the Revolution and of a suitable age for service.

The following form of acknowledgement is required:

Applicant further says that the said William Smith (name of ancestor from whom eligibility is derived) is the ancestor mentioned in the foregoing application, and that the statements hereinafter set forth are true to the best of her knowledge and belief.

This applicant also pledges allegiance to the United States of America and agrees to support its Constitution. This applies to applicants for membership within the United States of America and its territories.
