Applicant must provide documentation proving lineal descent for each statement of birth, marriage and death. This shall include a birth certificate naming her parents. Data submitted as proof is subject to DAR standards and interpretation. This applies to "new ancestors" and previously accepted lineage for which documentation was not required at the time of acceptance.

My ancestor's services during the Revolutionary War were as follows:

Benjamin Coddington enlisted in 1776 in Capt. Sear's Co., Essex Co., New Jersey. In 1779 he enlisted in a "troop of horse," at Woodbridge, New Jersey. He received a leg injury but later he volunteered "to to pirvattering". His company was successful in capturing a British Brig. Later, under Capt. Randolph and Capt John Story he helped capture 26 men on Staten Island. In December, 1780, he again volunteered and helped capture and burn a British shop in the Narrows.
