"Any woman is eligible for membership in the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution who is not less than eighteen years of age, and who is descended from a man or woman who, with unfailing loyalty to the cause of American Independence, served as a sailor, or as a soldier or civil officer in one of the several Colonies or States, or in the United Colonies or States, or as a recognized patriot, or rendered material aid thereto; provided the applicant is personally acceptable to the Society." (Constitution, Article III, Section 1.)

ANCESTOR'S SERVICES

The said Reuben Read who resided during the American Revolution at Mass. assisted in establishing American Independence, while acting in the capacity of Major, 4th Worcester County Regiment, Mass. Militia

My ancestors's services during the Revolutionary War were as follows:

Captain, Lexington Alarm Minute-men 1775
1st Major, 4th Worcester County Regiment, Mass. Militia, 1776

Reuben Read was a Major of Militia raised under Maj. Gen. Ward. After the capture of Burgoyne's Army at Saratoga, Major Read was detailed to General Heath who then had command of the Eastern Division of the Army to take charge of the Hessian and British troops, then prisoners of war at Cambridge; and who soon after removed them to Rutland, Worcester County
