

Recent Deaths

YOST:—George Yost, of Lock Haven, died of an attack of acute indigestion at 3 o'clock Sunday morning while visiting his daughter, Mrs. Elsie Masden, of Blanchard. Deceased was 70 years of age and is survived by one son and four other daughters: Milford Yost, of Detroit, Mich., and Mrs. James Hollick, Jersey Shore; Mrs. Don Henninger, Warren, Ohio; Mrs. Fred Shook and Mrs. Helen Bloom, Williamsport; also by four brothers, Albert, David and Frank Yost, of Lock Haven, and Thomas Yost, of Erie. The body was transferred to Lock Haven and funeral services were held on Wednesday afternoon.
