Dear Ms. Hudson,

Thank you for your application for new ancestor George Reiman. We need more information from you to complete your paper.

After looking over the documentation submitted for this new ancestor, several things are still missing. First is residence. Proof that George Reiman in generation 9 was living in New Jersey and moved to PA prior to the Revolution is needed, since Peter in generation 8 gets married in New Jersey in 1799. Also needed is proof that Peter Ryman in generation 8 is the son of George Reiman in generation 9. The pages of the county and family histories sent with your documentation do not cite sources for the information they present, and the information is dates of birth and death and family relationships from over a century prior to the publishing of any of the books. Other proof is needed of the link between generations 8 and 9.

Also needed is proof that Joseph Ryman in generation 7 who was born in NJ and is enumerated in the 1850 census in Franklin Co IN is the son of Peter Ryman and Mary Swesey in generation 8 who died in PA. With no provable place of birth for Peter, there is no overlap in places for generations 7 and 8. An 1850 census might be found to prove Mary's place of birth as NJ, but that was not sent.

As well, no documentation was sent to prove that Charlotte Eugenia Moore in generation 5 is the daughter of George Gordon and Sallie Maude McCay Moore in generation 6. Because the lineage branches off from previously proven applications, this link needs to be proven.

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As to the issues with the parentage of George Gordon Moore, more information is needed. None of the documentation sent specifically named George's father as Gideon Ryman, but rather gave him the last name Moore on George's DC. Charles' information also gave his father's last name as Moore, and he was not proven as a brother of George. The infant Rose's burial record named her father only as G Ryman, and no documentation that mentioned Rose as Gideon's wife gave her maiden name, including the marriage record sent. As they are not found on census records together, some other documentation, such as court records of the divorce that name the children, might be found to prove George's parentage.

If any part of this is not provable, as mentioned previously, it might be advisable to join through the ancestor your mother joined through, Benjamin Stearns, A109285. If you would like to do so, please sign the transfer letter below and return it with new pages 2, 3, and 4.

I look forward to receiving this additional information. Please note that the allotted time for verification is two years from the date of initial review by the Staff Genealogist, even when new information is gathered and sent. If your application is not verified within this time period, it will be returned to you. The supporting documentation will not be returned and all vital records will be shredded. The \$75.00 fee is non-refundable. **You must submit a copy of this letter with your response. Documentation received without the letter will not be processed.**
