²The Gilead Records are on file at the Gilead Town Office, Gilead, Maine.

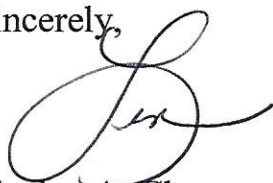
³The Cemetery Book was published by the Gilead Historical Society and compiled by Hugh and Linsley Chapman.

⁴The pictures are of the Lary South Cemetery (sometimes referred to as the Hosea Lary Cemetery or Pine Grove Cemetery).

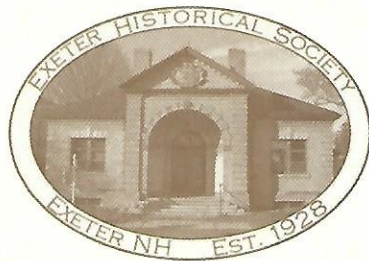
⁵The pictures are of the Lary North Cemetery (sometimes referred to as the Tallyrand G. Lary Cemetery)

Here is what I was able to find on the Lary family. Cornelius was definitely in Exeter on the town books in 1664 and on a scouting expedition in 1710.

Thomas Lary went on the Rounsberg Expedition

But I could not find any mention of Joseph, either senior or junior. Nor did I find them, either of them, in the State Revolutionary War Rolls (though there was a Jacob Lary, two John Larys, a William Lary and a Stephen Lary - none from Exeter.)
