Published in the Sunday News: Charleston, South Carolina,

March 12, 1899.

Endorsed: "List of Capt. Drayton's Volunteer Compa."
"Charleston, 15th August, 1775.

"We whose Names are hereunto subscribed do mutually agree to unite and to form a Company of Foot; to be commanded by

"That the said Company shall consist of one Captain, three Lieutenants, one Ensign, a Sergeant Major, four serjents, four Corporals, and One hundred privates or whatever other number the Council of Safety will allow:-

"That the officers be chosen by Ballot from among the subscribers.

"That as soon as fifty have subscribed a Meeting may be called to appoint a Committee to apply for Commissions, to determine on a proper Uniform, to choose the officers and to consider of Rules proper to be observed by the Company.

"That it is strongly recommended, that the Uniform be: Greenlet French Frook Coats--with white Lappels, Collars and Cuffs, with white Buttons and white waistcoat and Breeches; to wear Buskins and Black Garters. The officers, by way of Distinction, to wear Silver Epaulets--a Silver Girdle and Loop and Button in their hats--to have Silver Gorgets, on which to be engraved in a Circle--an armed hand holding a drawn sword--round which a Motto, "et Deus omnipotens". The privates to wear military cocked hats with cockades.
